Commissioner Jimenez reminded us about the October Tracy Seniors Association's pancake breakfast event.

Commissioner Arbogast reported that he attended the first two fall Rollin Rec programs and was very impressed. He expressed his continued support for the program, noting the overwhelming compliments he has received about the staff, children, and parents. He commended the program's success and stated it is off to a great start.

Vice Chair Shrout stated he drove by the MGRC and asked if they could get a tour of the facility.

Brian MacDonald, Director of Parks, Recreation and Community Services, stated yes; however, we are waiting for the heat to calm down. Once the heat subsides, we will have staff coordinate the tour.

Chair Lieberg noted that the final block party would be held tomorrow night and would feature Reggae Music.

Chair Lieberg noted that a park opening celebration had been held for Dan Schack Park and asked who else had attended, in addition to Commissioner Jimenez. Commissioner Arbogast stated he attended. Chair Lieberg further recalled a previous discussion about placing plaques in parks named after individuals and inquired whether this park had one. Commissioner Arbogast stated that there were many testimonials read on his behalf and that there was a large crowd that attended

Brian MacDonald, Director of Parks, Recreation and Community Services, stated no, there was not one in this park, as the Tracy Hills Monuments don't have them, as they are different from our standard signs.

Chair Lieberg asked whether, in addition to the park sign, there was a plaque placed in the park that recognized who they are, as he feels this is highly important.

Brian MacDonald, Director of Parks, Recreation and Community Services, stated he will mention this to his team.

Chair Lieberg mentioned that the city's proposed Aquatic Center plans will be going to council on September 16th, and he encourages all to attend.

**RECEIVE AN INFORMATIONAL UPDATE REGARDING THE RENAMING OF THE
ELLIS DOG PARK TO DUKE'S DOG PARK**

BACKGROUND

The Ellis Dog Park, located at 4355 Summit Drive, is a 2.41-acre special-use park constructed within the Ellis Specific Plan area. The park was formally accepted by the City Council on March 18, 2025, and opened to the public on March 19, 2025.

The Ellis Specific Plan (ESP) was initially approved and executed between the City and Surland Companies on January 22, 2013. The ESP was subsequently amended in 2018, 2019, and 2021, respectively. Section 2.2.6 of the ESP (entitled "Park Networks") notes and contemplates that all park names in Ellis shall be approved by the City Council as a part of the ESP. Section 2.2.6 also contemplates that any changes to park names in Ellis may be changed by mutual agreement of the City and Ellis Property Owners Association (EPOA). While the City has a separate Council-approved Park Naming Policy (Resolution No. 2021-013), renaming this park must follow the process outlined in the Ellis Specific Plan, which requires mutual agreement between the City and the Ellis Property Owners Association (EPOA).

On June 6, 2024, the Parks & Community Services Commission reviewed the applications received from the public naming process for the two new parks in Tracy Hills. Staff received an initial request to name one of those parks in honor of K9 Duke. While the Commission prioritized the top three names for Council's consideration, the Commission also expressed interest in renaming the Ellis Dog Park in honor of K9 Duke.

Staff received a request to rename the Ellis Dog Park in honor of Duke, the San Joaquin County Sheriff's Office K9, who was tragically killed in the line of duty in February 2023 while protecting Tracy Police Department officers.

In July 2025, the City and the Ellis Property Owners Association (EPOA) began discussions about the possibility of renaming the Ellis Dog Park to Duke's Dog Park. Both parties met and conferred in good faith to change the name of the park from "Ellis Dog Park" to "Duke's Dog Park."

DISCUSSION

The City and the EPOA have mutually agreed to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to change the name of the park from Ellis Dog Park to Duke's Dog Park in honor of K9 Duke. Surland, the master developer, has agreed to fund the design, construction, and installation of a new entry sign for the park entry portal, as well as a new bronze plaque installed immediately adjacent to the signage.

Staff will continue coordinating with the developer on the logistics for installing the new signage, and a ribbon-cutting ceremony will be planned for fall 2025 to commemorate the park's renaming and official opening.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the General Fund for this item at this time. All costs related to the design, construction, and installation of the new park signage will be funded by the developer.

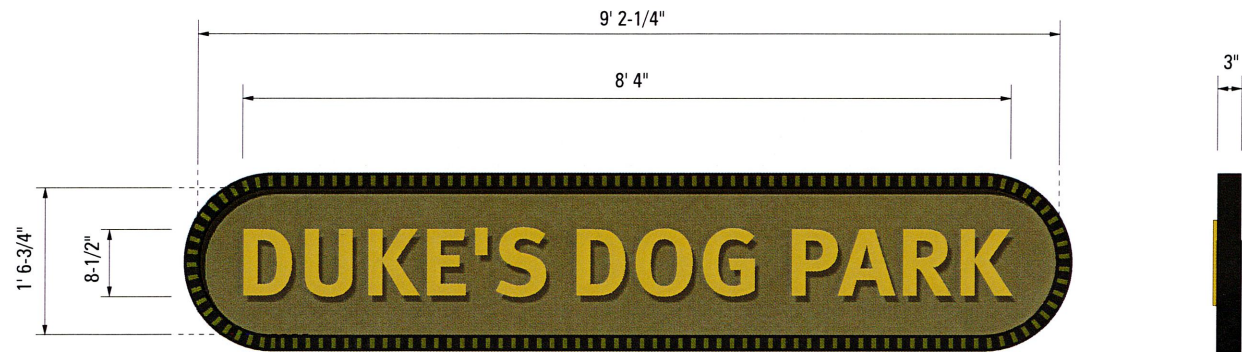

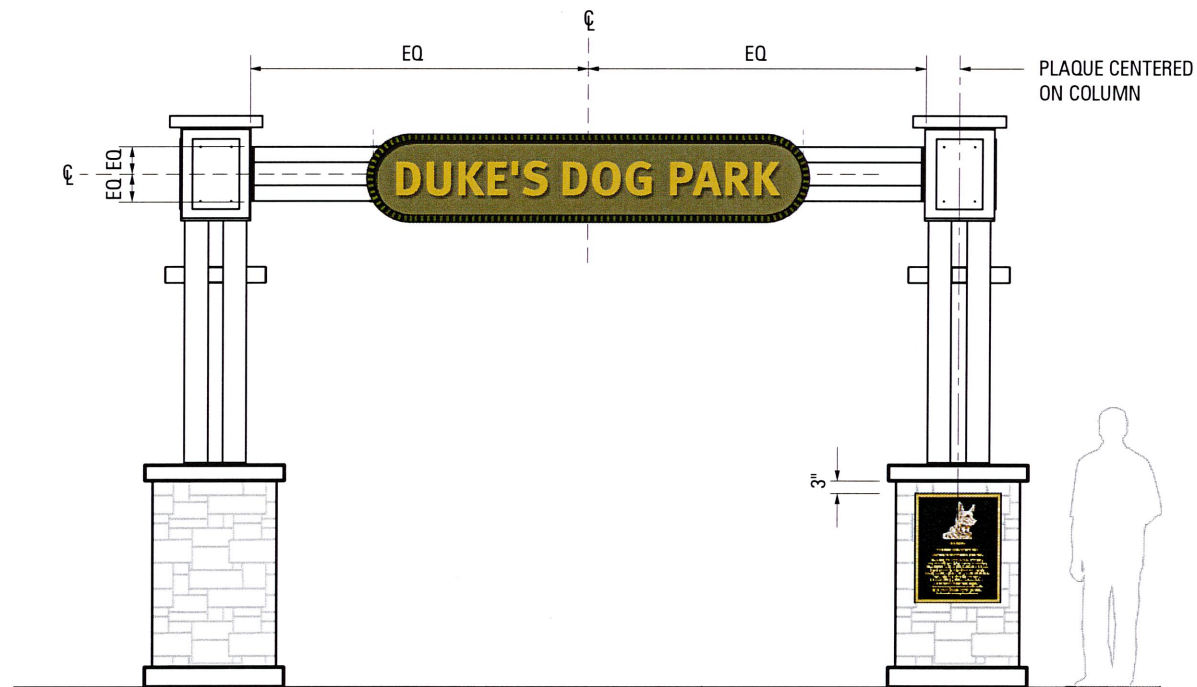

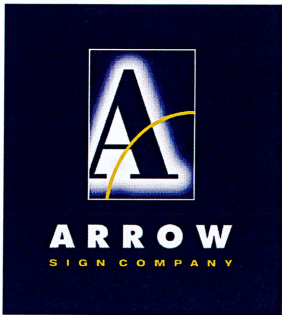

**REVIEW AND APPROVE THE TRIWAY DEVELOPMENT NEIGHBORHOOD PARK
CONCEPTUAL MASTER PLAN.**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Brookfield Residential (Developer) is proposing to build a new 3.58-acre neighborhood park as part of their residential development (the Triway). The Triway Development is located on Valpico Rd, near the intersection of Valpico Rd and Tracy Blvd, in between the Raley's grocery store and the Altium Packaging facility. Staff is bringing this item to the Commission as per Chapter 7.16 of the City of Tracy Municipal Code, Parks and Community Services Commission, 7.16.030 Powers and Duties (e) *advise the Council on the subject of recreation and facility master planning and development.*

DISCUSSION

Staff have met with the Developer to discuss the 3.58-acre site, programming, amenities, functionality, ongoing maintenance, and overall connectivity of the park to the rest of the Tracy park system. The design of this park provides the community with highly desired amenities such as: contemporary playgrounds, a sports court, a picnic area, a large open lawn for flexible play, and a walking loop connected to other circulation elements in the park.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the General Fund for this item currently.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Commission review and approve the Triway development neighborhood park conceptual master plan, including layout, amenities, and furnishings.

Park Access Gaps and Neighborhood Park Opportunity Areas

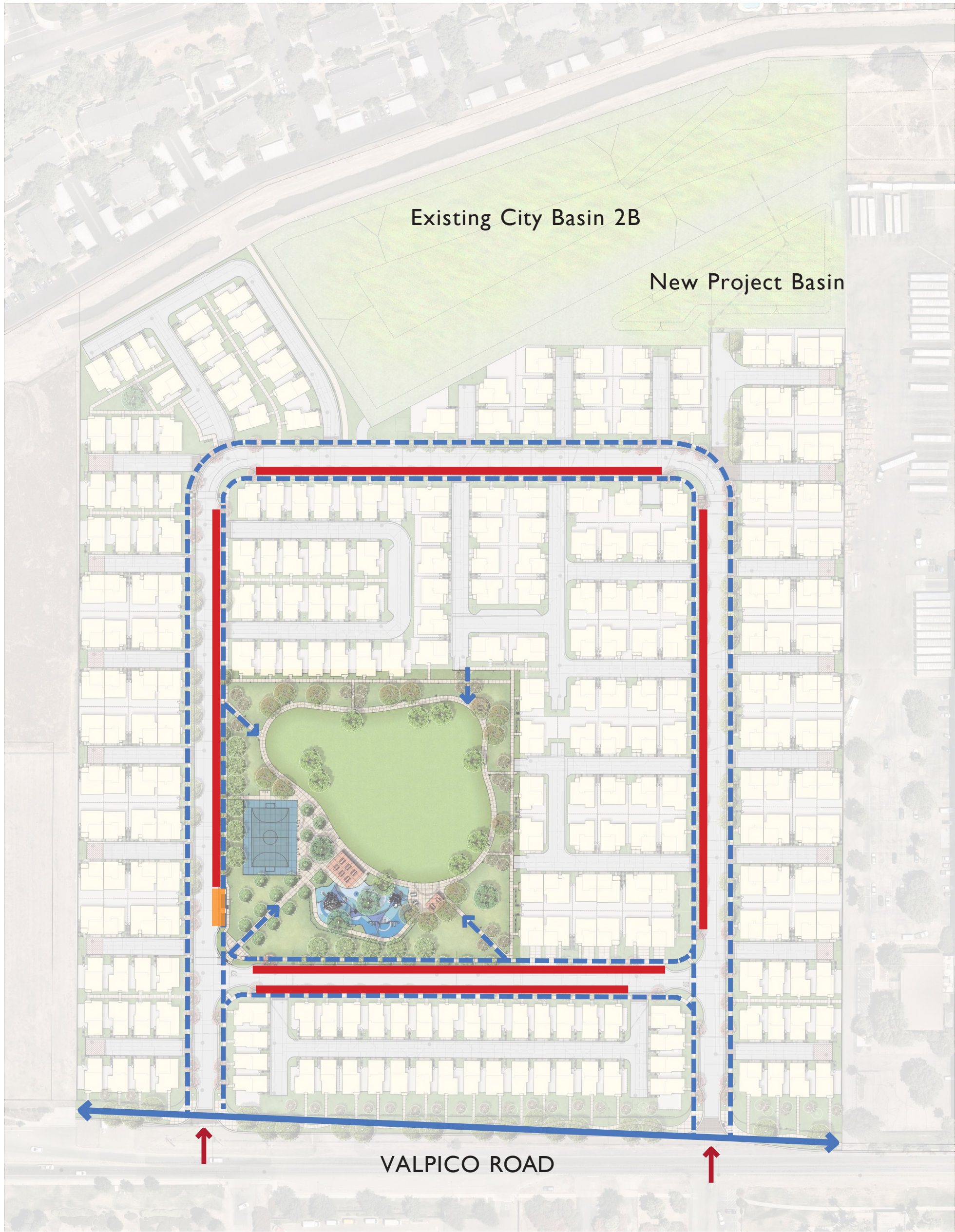




PROJECT OVERVIEW

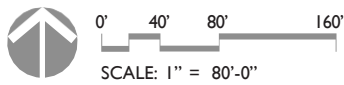
- The Project will build **275 new homes** with options to install 49 JADUs, including 3 typologies, single family detached homes and duet homes attached at the garage
- The Project offers a range of **affordable-by-design** small lot unit sizes and prices, thereby addressing the “missing middle” currently underserved in the City of Tracy
- The **JADUs** are located on the bottom floor of 49 units and scattered throughout the development which will allow residents to house family members or rent to others
- The Project will construct a new Community Park and on-site trail to connect a key piece of the City’s trail system. The Park and trail is approx. 3.7 acres, significantly larger than the 2.6 acres required by code
- A **public loop road** will be constructed through the development with two east/west connections to Valpico Road. New frontage improvements will also be made to Valpico Road

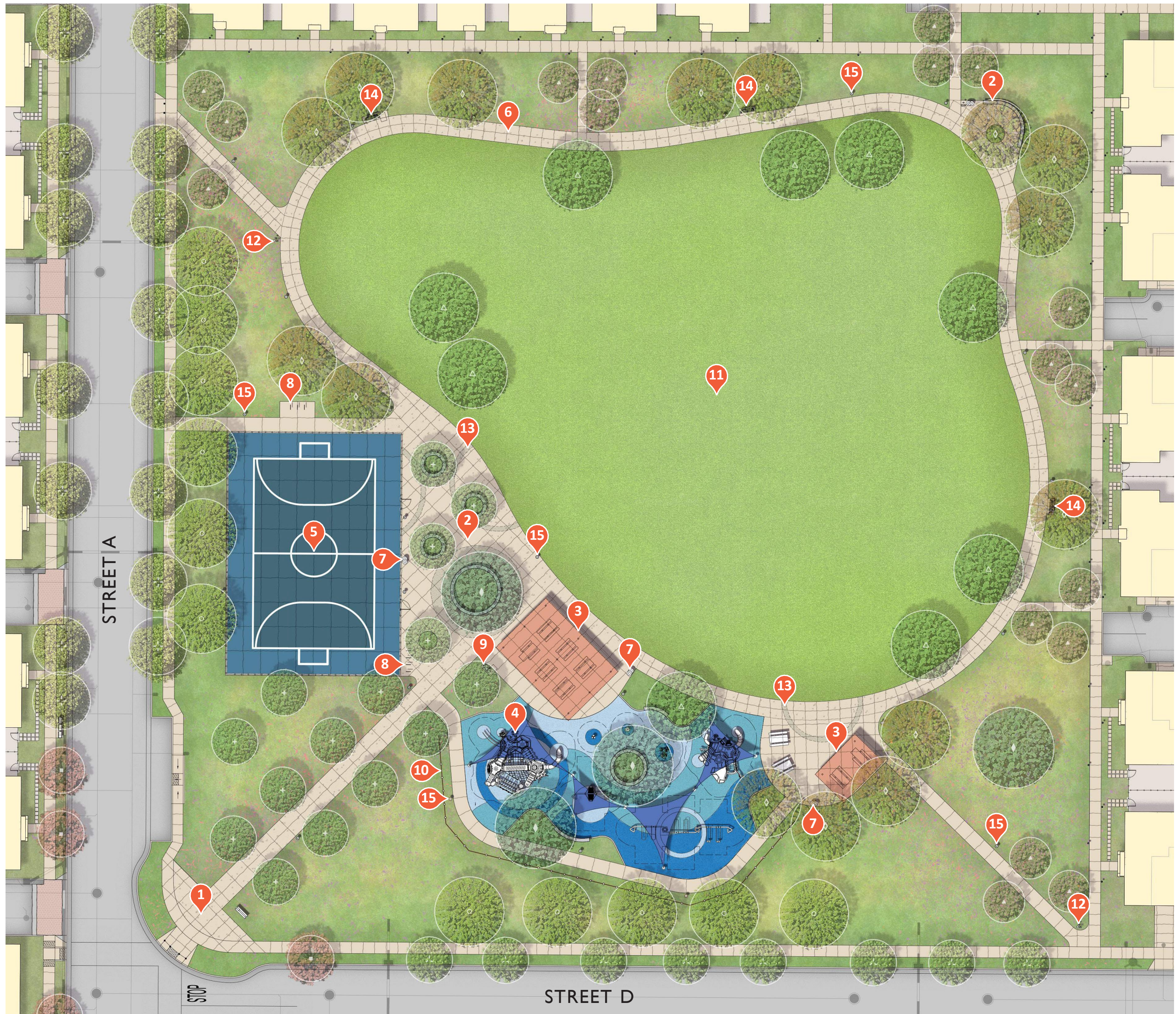

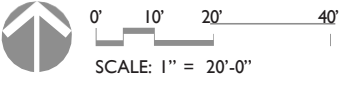
